- First and second (family) name of author(s) (bold, small letters, 12 point body)
- Address of first (presenting) author (small letter, 12 point body)
- Text (12 point body)
- Send by email: use rtf format and MS word PC. Give the file the name of the first author
- The abstract must be a maximum of one A4 page, single spaced. Margins: 2.5 cm, font: Times New Roman
- Request for oral platform or poster
- Identify preferred session from list above, if applicable (other sessions may be organised based on abstracts received)
- Abstracts must be submitted with a Registration form
